



Find a mealtime this week when everyone is home. Take it in turns to ask each other questions using the Conversation Starter Cards.

- Each card includes one question, with topics related to help seeking, personal strengths and emotional literacy, as well as questions about friends, family, school.
- There are 30 questions in total and while some cards may be best suited to older children (mid to late primary), many of the questions can be answered by pre-schoolers and those in the early grades.



District Athletics Championships

On Monday, 26th of August forty-three students from Grades 3-6 went to the Newport Athletics track to compete in the District Athletics Championships.



Our students represented our school with distinction once again, displaying fine sportsmanship and trying their best in their individual and relay events.

Overall, and for the third year in a row, our school finished in second place which is a super effort. We won 886 points in total which was only fifty points behind Williamstown PS.

A big thank-you to the parents and student-teachers who helped run the track events on the day (hurdles, 100m, 200m and 800m). Your assistance is greatly appreciated.

We have seventeen students who have qualified for the next level of competition. The Division Athletics Finals will take place on the 12th of September at the Werribee Athletics track.

Intensive Swimming Program Prep—Yr 2

This year, the Newport Lakes Primary School intensive swimming program will run for our students in grades P – 2. The program will run for ten days from **October 21st to November 1st**.

We have four sessions per day and each session will run for 45 minutes. Our first session will start at 12pm and our final session will conclude at 3pm. I will advise parents of their child's time slot when all forms have been returned.

The cost of this year's program will be **approximately \$90 - \$120** and will be confirmed as soon as numbers have been finalised. Newport Lakes Primary School believe it is very important that **all** primary school children learn to swim. The school is committed to work with all families to ensure every child is given the opportunity to learn this skill. If any families have difficulties with the cost of the program please see your child's teacher, Janet or David. Parents will be able to pay via instalments or in full on Compass. The price includes 1:10 instructor/child ratio and transport by bus to and from the venue. The bus will have seatbelts.

To ensure your child secures their spot in the swimming program please consent to the expression of interest on Compass by Friday 13th September .

Our students in grades three, four, five and six will not participate in our intensive swimming program this year. Instead, they will be involved in a Beach Life Saving Program which will be conducted in late Term Four. Details of the beach program will be sent home early next term.

The school has taken this decision to include Yr 3 students in the beach program due to the increased numbers in the junior school and to minimise the disruption to the Yr 3/4 program.




