Principal's Report



Dear parents/carers

School Oval & Sensory Garden

The upgrading of the school oval is well on schedule and will be all completed in readiness for the students' return in term 3. Some further line markings for PE activities, inclusion of AFL goal posts, an infill of sand and the removal of the safety fencing is all that is required to complete the project and then the school will finally have an oval and play area all the students can enjoy.

The development of a school oval for our students has been long in the making with limited previous success. We have tried all different types of surfaces including re-seeding and rotation of areas, but a natural turf surface has not been able to withstand the 'heavy duty' usage of our students playing on the small surface area. The new artificial turf oval will ensure we have a safe surface that all students can play upon all year around for many years to come and we will finally have some footy goal posts at our school.

Our next project in the development of our school grounds will be the Sensory Garden along the fence line near the MPR. A Concept Plan was in the last newsletter and a large coloured display is available to view in the school office area. If you would like to contribute some feedback or ideas, please send them to the school before we meet with the Landscape Architect next Monday morning to discuss our final plan.



Importance of being on time

Being punctual is a very good skill to possess and this includes being at school on time. Students are able to arrive any time between 8.45am and before the bell rings at 9.00am. After a very good start to the return to school, we are noticing an ever-increasing number of children arriving 5 – 10 minutes after 9.00am. A number of children are finding the departing with their parents at the gate quite difficult and the arriving at school at 9.00am is even making them more anxious.

All children are temperature tested at the beginning of the day when they enter class and a late arrival will often mean that they will miss the testing and then have to attend the office to be checked making them even later on starting their learning for the day. Parents should aim at arriving between 8.45-8.55am to allow their children a short play with their friends and feel relaxed before they enter their classrooms at 9.00am. This will assist in your child having a good start to the day and an even better and more enjoyable day at school.



Lost Property

With the cold start to the mornings, many children are coming to school wearing windcheaters, jackets, coats and school beanies. As the weather warms up, often the child will take off a layer of clothing and leave it where they were playing. It is important that all items of clothing and any personal items such as lunch boxes, drink bottles, balls etc. are **clearly and continuously** labelled so we can assist in the return of these items.

Lost property is collected from the school yard and placed in the lost property box in the school office area. At the end of each week, if the item is clearly labelled, it will be returned to your child's classroom. If the clothing is not labelled then it will be sent to the Second-hand clothing store or eventually be disposed.

We strongly recommend that parents continually check that any piece of clothing that a child can take off, or any personal item that they can leave in the school ground, is clearly labelled with their name.

Enrolling 2021 Preps

We are currently taking enrolments for 2021 Preps. If you have a child who turns 5 before 30th April 2021, your place of residence is within the school network neighbourhood zone and would like to enrol them at Newport Lakes Primary School please contact the office to collect an enrolment form, or alternatively, enrolment details and forms are available on the school website.

Enrolments for 2021 students should be lodged at the school office or online before Friday August 7th 2020.

It is very important for our school planning purposes that we are aware of any siblings that may be enrolling in Preps next year.

If you believe your child may be transferring or re-locating to another school, the earlier you can notify the school the greater you can assist the school in its forward planning and preparation.

School Attendance All Victorian government schools must contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. This requirement supports student safety and wellbeing. Schools need to know when and why a child is absent, and parents/carers need to know if their child is not at school. Prompt communication also promotes daily school attendance.

Parents and carers must notify the school of their child's absence as soon as possible on the day of absence using the schools' preferred method, including online, by telephone or by email. Attendance rolls are taken before 9.30am every day in every class. If a child is not in attendance, and the school has not received notification that the child will be absent, a SMS text will be automatically sent to the parents advising them that their child is absent.

As part of this requirement there is a *Compass Kiosk* which electronically records late attendees and collates all attendance data. If a child is late attending class, or a parent brings their child to school after 9am, they are to enter their details on the 'Compass Kiosk' and this information will be updated to the child's attendance data.

Parent Teacher Interviews & Online Mid-Year reports. The student's online Semester 1 written student report will be available for access through the parent Compass portal from next Monday afternoon and then the parent teacher interviews will be conducted via a phone call on the following Tuesday and Wednesday.

Due to the disruptions of the school year caused by COVID-19, the semester 1 reports will be focusing on a review of the remote learning program and will not include an assessment score.

Parent Teacher interviews will be conducted by telephone due to restrictions of parental entry to school grounds and social distance requirements

Australian Mathematics Competition

Thursday 30th July 2020

Dear Parents/Guardians

The Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC) has been held annually since 1978. Your child is invited to enter this internationally recognised competition.

One of the largest annual events on the Australian education calendar, the AMC was the first competition of its kind in Australia and is now one of the largest of its type in the world. More than 30 countries participate each year.

The competition aims to be accessible to all students from Years 3 to 12, not just the mathematically gifted. There is an emphasis on problem solving, a valuable life skill, and the questions are designed to be fun for the student. The AMC consists of five separate papers, each with 30 questions in the Middle Primary (Years 3 and 4), Upper Primary (Years 5 and 6). Time allowed is 60 minutes for the primary papers.

Over 1,000 students share the prizes and around 50% of participants qualify to receive a Certificate of High Distinction, Distinction or Credit. All other entrants in the competition receive a Certificate of Participation or a Proficiency Certificate. All students are also provided with a detailed report showing how they performed on each problem with wider statistical rankings.

Although it is aimed at the average student, the AMC also identifies gifted students. A prestigious Australian Mathematics Competition medal is awarded to students with an outstanding result, both within a State or country and overall in the competition.

The AMC is administered by the not-for-profit Australian Mathematics Trust (AMT), which is under the Trusteeship of the University of Canberra. The problems created for AMC papers are set to the highest possible standards by volunteer teams of the most experienced mathematics teachers and academics in the country.

In order to prepare students for the AMC try our online practice problems. Our website www.amt.edu.au also provides details of other valuable mathematics and informatics enrichment programs offered by the AMT. We recommend the AMC to you as an opportunity to encourage your child in the study of mathematics.


