Dear Parents /Guardians,

Newport Lakes Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of the voluntary financial contributions for 2022.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian Curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. However, your ongoing support ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Our school only requests contributions for items that we believe add value to the school experience for students. All contributions go specifically towards items and activities that help improve your child's educational experience.

Your support has made a huge difference to our school and allowed us to:

- grow and offer a wider range of subjects and special curriculum experiences, including enhanced digital learning opportunities by developing our online subscription platforms to better support students both at school and through remote learning
- purchase additional iPads for the younger year levels to use within their classes or from home which is further enhanced by the upgrading of the school for faster WIFI and internet
- upgrade our grounds with the new synthetic grass (athletics oval) and sensory garden
- continually replenish the school library with an array of different books.

Financial Support for Families

Refunds

Our school will consider requests for partial or full refunds of payments made by parents on a case-by-case basis, taking into account the individual circumstances.

Generally we will not be able to refund payments made for items purchased or costs that have already been paid where those funds have already been transferred to a third party. For example, camp costs when a child becomes unwell and cannot attend in circumstances where the payment has already been made or committed to a third party and no refund is available to the school. Where possible, we will make this clear to parents at the time of payment.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
