New Senior Playground

After 13 years of heavy duty 'wear and tear', the senior school playground equipment will be replaced later this year. Many of the parts of the equipment are wearing out and need to be updated and replaced to remain safe for our children.

After numerous meetings with members of playground manufacturers, JSC members and senior students a new and exciting senior playground has been planned for the school. The students even had input and the final say on the colours of the equipment – grey poles, with blue and orange equipment (it looks better than it sounds!).

Funded by school council and money raised at our 2022 School Fete, the new equipment is currently being manufactured and will be installed in early August.

Welcome Back

This week we warmly welcome back Ashlee Johnson (nee Shacklock) from her family leave to replace Lisa Richards in the Prep SS classroom for the remainder of the 2023 school year. Ashlee is an outstanding teacher and is well known to all the children and staff and will be warmly received in the Prep team.

In the current times of teacher shortages, we are very fortunate at NLPS to be able to engage such high-quality teaching staff for our children and classrooms.

Prep Enrolments 2024

We are currently taking enrolments for 2024 Preps. If you have a child that turns 5 before 30th April 2024, and would like to enrol them at Newport Lakes Primary School please download the forms that are available on the school website or alternatively contact the office for assistance.

School Tours are currently being conducted over the next few weeks (May 10th, 18th & 26th) and an online 2024 Prep Information evening is planned for 6.00pm on Thursday 18th May. Bookings for both the tours and the information evening can be made on CompassTix via the school website.

Enrolments for 2024 students should be lodged at the school office before the end of Term 2 (23rd June). Families that are within our 'school zone' or have siblings already enrolled, are eligible for enrolment at NLPS in 2024. It is very important for our school planning purposes that we are aware of any siblings that may be enrolling in Preps next year.

Also, if you believe your child may be transferring or re-locating to another school in 2024, the earlier you can notify the school the greater you can assist the school in its forward planning and preparation.

Personal Accident Insurance and Ambulance Cover

A friendly reminder that the Education Department does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents and guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs.

Student accident insurance policies are available from some commercial insurers. These cover a range of medical expenses not covered by Medicare or private health insurance. They can be obtained by parents and guardians for individual children.

Parents are strongly advised to take out family insurance cover or check to see if emergency ambulance assistance is covered under their health insurance policy.

The school does not wait for prior permission from parents to call an ambulance. It is the school's policy to always call an ambulance immediately if there is a belief that the emergency service may be required for the health and safety of the child.

Pupil Free Day

A reminder to all parents and carers that a pupil free day will be conducted on Wednesday 24th May 2023. There will be no school on this day for all students.

Apart from a bit of head wind on the Saturday afternoon, everything else went very well and we all made a safe arrival to Port Fairy on Sunday. I would like to sincerely thank the many families that wished me all the best and made generous donations of sponsorship for the ride. I am very pleased to inform you that our team raised total of \$16 560 to go directly towards the student wellbeing programs and the children in need at the school.

Blackshaws Rd. Road Survey

Over the last few years there has been a significant increase in the traffic on Blackshaws Rd. Large building programs, re-alignment of traffic flow, increased housing and major traffic works have all contributed to a much busier road making it very difficult for pedestrians and cyclists to safely cross this street.

School Council have made repeated requests to the Hobsons Bay council, and then to Vicroads, for improved safety for our families and community.

Vicroads are currently conducting an online survey seeking to understand how pedestrians, bike riders and all road users experience Blackshaws Rd. It is very important that the school community uses this opportunity to have our say towards an improved traffic flow at the eastern end of Blackshaws Rd.

As Blackshaws Rd. is a major road in our area and has a significant impact on all our lives, now and in the future, I would strongly urge that all parents and families take 10 minutes to complete the survey. This is an opportunity to be part of the future planning of our community and without your input, your voices may not be heard.

Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and NLPS is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 8 September 2023.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Email Teacher Librarian Krissy Barr for a digital copy of login details.

Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books. Year 3 and 4 students will login this term during a library session. Years 5-6 will login to participate either this term (5/6L and 5/6J) or next (5/6A, 5/6M and 5/6E) during library. All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.
